



HIGHLIGHTS OF THE REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING June 2025

Lacombe County CPO Community Update

Council received a community update report from Mark Sproule, Manager of Community Peace Officer (CPO) Services. The report detailed enforcement hours and statistics. Sproule noted CPO's emphasis on education instead of penalties, and the continued support of the School Resource Officer. Council discussed enforcement of unsightly residential properties.

Parkland Community Planning Services

Council supported the proposed 25% increase in PCPS membership costs. Members will vote on the proposed increase during the annual general meeting on June 26th in Lacombe. PCPS is a non-profit organization that provides a variety of planning and development services to municipalities and the private sector, particularly in central Alberta. They specialize in land use policy planning, site assessments, and subdivision services, offering professional guidance on development applications, subdivision applications, and land use bylaw amendments.

Lacombe Regional Emergency Management Model

Council decided to support the Lacombe Regional Emergency Management Partnership (LREMP) model of a Joint Emergency Management Agency with a Joint Emergency Advisory Committee. Under this model Clive retains local authority and decision-making pertaining to states of local emergencies (SOLE) and delegates tasks to the Joint Advisory Committee (JAC).

Delegated tasks to the JAC include:

- Cause disaster plans or programs to be put in action
- Develop and approve policies on emergency management
- Administer the Lacombe Regional Emergency Management Agency

Canadian Postmasters and Assistants Association (CPAA)

Council authorized Mayor Henry to draft a letter in support of the importance of rural postal services to M.P. Blaine Calkins – Ponoka/ Didsbury.
