



HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE REGULAR COUNCIL MEETINGS

February 9th, 2026

Repeal Bylaws

Council repealed Bylaw #462-04 (the Skateboard bylaw) and Bylaw #429-99 (the Freedom of Information Designated Officer bylaw).

Community Standards Bylaw

Administration was tasked with developing a Community Standards Bylaw to address neighbourhood livability, nuisance issues and public behaviour in Clive. The draft bylaw will be presented to Council for review and input on a later date.

Cemetery Bylaw #516-17

Council directed administration to prepare a revised Cemetery Bylaw to enhance cemetery operations, align with modern practices, and reflect community values. The revised bylaw will be presented to Council on a later date.

2026 National Volunteer Week

Council decided that Clive would partner with the Lacombe and District FCSS to celebrate National Volunteer Week in Clive. This celebration highlights outstanding contributions from volunteer's past, present, and future and provides a valuable opportunity to thank and recognize our community's volunteers.

Alberta Municipalities' FCSS Advocacy

Council directed Mayor Luci Henry to send a letter to MLA Jennifer Johnson and Minister of Assisted Living and Social Services Jason Nixon regarding the importance of FCSS and the need to align funding levels with population growth and inflation.

Clive's 2026 Policing Priorities

Council determined that Clive's policing priorities to communicate to the Blackfalds RCMP for 2026/27 are to:

1. Maintain positive relationships within the community through a visible police presence.
2. Focus on crime reduction, including domestic violence, crimes against persons, and property crime.
3. Address mental health concerns by supporting officer safety and providing tools to de-escalate and mediate situations.
4. Prioritize traffic and road safety, with an emphasis on impaired, speeding, and distracted driving.

Moose Hide Campaign

The council has declared May 14, 2026, Moose Hide Campaign Day. Administration is directed to promote the campaign to Clive residents, encouraging donations and the wearing of moosehide pins as a symbol against violence against women and children, and taking practical steps toward reconciliation.

Council Inquiry – Tree Trimming Requirements

Council asked about tree trimming requirements at the south end of 48th Street near Clive's water house. Administration confirmed that the required clearances and sight triangle standards are outlined in Traffic Bylaw #499-12 and the Land Use Bylaw. Administration advised that the location complies with all Village bylaws.

Council motioned that the Village of Clive partner with the Clive Public Library to host a Village-wide cleanup event in recognition of Earth Day on April 22nd.
