



HIGHLIGHTS OF THE REGULAR COUNCIL MEETINGS

January 12th, 2026

Master Rates and Fees Bylaw#574-26

Council approved the Master Rates and Fees Bylaw# 574-26 establishing the 2026 rates and fees for goods and services delivered in Clive. The updated Master Rates and Fees Bylaw #574-26 is available online at clive.ca.

Clive Fire Response

A motion to amend the Clive Fire Policy increasing fire response rates and fees did not receive the support of council. Current fire suppression response rates remain in effect. Residents and ratepayers will continue to be invoiced for fire calls and motor vehicle accident responses. You are encouraged to contact your insurance company to ensure you have adequate coverage for fire response costs.

Water House Upgrade and Reservoir Feasibility Study

Council approved the Water House Upgrade and Reservoir Feasibility Study and directed Administration to research and apply for grant funding to support the project. The total cost was estimated \$2,383,680 for storage expansion and upgrades to Clive's water house.

Snow Removal Policy

Council reviewed and confirmed the snow removal policy. It was noted that on weekends and holidays, the village provides only minimal snow removal to ensure priority roads are passable during major snow events.

Council Inquiries

Council inquired about who to contact for highway maintenance. Administration responded that road conditions on numbered highways can be reported to the **"Main Roads"** 24/7 hotline at **1-877-875-3263**.

January 26th, 2026

Bylaw Review Schedule

Council approved the 2026 bylaw review schedule and priorities and directed administration to explore a new Community Standards Bylaw. The Community Standards Bylaw would combine several of Clive's existing bylaws with neighbourhood rules into one updated regulation.

Asset Management

Council directed Administration to continue the annual road condition inspections and report findings to Council. These yearly reviews allow the village to plan road maintenance to extend the life of the Village's roads.

Council decided to contribute \$625 towards the Highway Event Sign replacement project, funded from the Entrance Sign Reserve.

Pink Shirt Day

Council directed administration to promote Pink Shirt Day on February 25th, 2026, and encourage residents to wear pink on February 25th in support of the anti-bullying initiative.

Fun Fest 2026

Council set June 20th, 2026, as the date for FunFest 2026. The first planning meeting for FunFest is scheduled for February 19th at 11:00 a.m. at the Village Office.

Council Inquiries

Administration responded to the following inquiries:

1. Snow removal for the Clive Athletic and Agricultural Society (CAAS)
 - CAAS and the Village could enter into a Snow Removal Agreement however Clive may not be able to meet their needs in a timely manner. The Village's snow removal policy indicates snow can be cleared on non-profit properties on a third priority basis; after all village streets are completed.
2. Fiber Optic Internet
 - Clive has not been eligible for broadband grant funding because according to Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) records, Clive is considered to already have adequate internet coverage meeting minimum speed requirements through existing providers.
 - A cnWave wireless mesh system may be a more affordable alternative to fibre internet.
