



HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE MARCH 23, 2026 REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING

Cemetery Bylaw #576-26

Council passed first reading of Cemetery Bylaw #576-26. The bylaw updates the regulations governing cemetery operations in Alberta, ensuring clarity around administration, plot management, and maintenance standards.

Obsolete Policies

Council moved to rescind the following outdated policies that are no longer required or have been replaced by current bylaws and procedures:

- Animal Control Fines Policy
- Dog Complaints AB Animal Control Policy
- Servicing Standards & Development Agreement Policy
- Merry-Go-Round & Other Village Recreation Equipment Use Policy
- Council Allowances & Honorariums Policy
- Expenditure Policy
- Sewer Line Maintenance Policy
- Utility & Other Accounts Policy
- Renter's Utility Notice Policy
- Water Shut-Off Policy for Structure Fires

2026 Capital Program

Council approved the Capital Program as presented. The program identifies the roadwork and related infrastructure projects scheduled for implementation in the coming year.

Enhance Energy Tour

Council will attend a tour of Enhance Energy's facility on June 8, 2026, to gain a better understanding of the company's operations and regional energy initiatives.

Parkland Community Planning Services Closure

Council authorized Deputy Mayor Hallman to support the dissolution of Parkland Community Planning Services and its Regional Subdivision and Development Appeal Board. Council also approved payment of the Village's estimated liability of \$2,030.20 as part of the dissolution process.

Council Appoints Member to Clive Library Board

Council approved the appointment of Karen Yakimishyn to the Clive Library Board for a three-year term, effective April 1, 2026 to April 1, 2029.

Council Self Evaluation

Council discussed the timing and format of their annual self-evaluation and confirmed that the process will proceed in April to support ongoing governance and performance improvement.

Lacombe County Farm Safety Day

Council approved Councillor Fahey's attendance at Lacombe County's Farm Safety Day on June 10, 2026, as the Village's representative.
